



Dear Parents,

As educators, we are tasked with providing a safe and robust education for students. Part of our efforts in our school include embracing a program called Safe2Tell. I am confident that you will join me in agreeing that this program definitely complements our continual efforts to create safe spaces for children and youth to learn.

Safe2Tell Colorado is a state-funded prevention initiative program. It is a program of the Colorado Attorney General's Office and is available free to all schools and communities across Colorado. It began in 2004 as an anti-bullying program in the wake of the Columbine tragedy. Since 2004, Safe2Tell has received over 45,000 anonymous tip reports alerting committed, caring adults to incidents of bullying, suicide threats, planned school attacks, substance abuse, mental health concerns, and a myriad of concerning behaviors.

Backed by Colorado State law, Safe2Tell serves as the main resource to share information between schools and law enforcement. The goal is to take this information provided anonymously, and intervene at the earliest possible point in the life of a young person who is struggling. In doing so, this may not only save a life, but also prevent future acts of violence and other traumas.

The Safe2Tell model critically depends on the amount of awareness and education students, parents and community members have about the resource available to them. If you would like to learn more, I encourage you to check out their website www.safe2tell.org.
